Directions to Pick Up Location

**Building 550, West Hanover Avenue
Morris Township, NJ**

From Rt. 287: Take Lafayette Ave/Ridgedale Ave. exit 36- South, 36 B-North. Turn Right onto Ridgedale Ave. Drive approx 1 mile to Hanover Ave. (At light). Turn left and drive approx 4 miles (passing Fire & Police Academy) Make left on Raynor Road. Follow orange signs.

From Rt. 124: Follow to square in Morristown. Staying right around the square take Rt. 202 (Speedwell Avenue) North (passing Headquarters Plaza). Continue 2 miles to West Hanover Ave. (St. Virgil's church) Turn Left. Proceed about 2.4 miles to the top of the hill. Make left on Raynor Rd. Follow orange signs.

From Rt. 24 West: Exit 1B (follow signs for Fire & Police Academy) Turn right onto Hanover Ave. and drive approx 5 miles (passing Fire & Police Academy). Make Left on Raynor Road. Follow orange signs.

Morris County Soil Conservation District 2010 Seedling Selection

A Seedling is a tree which has grown up in the bed in which it was sown, remaining there one, two, or three years.

A Transplant, on the other hand, is a seedling which has been moved to another bed and set out separately a few inches apart. A 2-2 transplant has been in the seedling bed for two years and a transplant bed for 2 years. The transplant is hardier than a seedling and has a more extensive root system.

Colorado Blue Spruce - *Picea pungens glauca*, attains a height of 70 to 100 feet tall. This 2-2 transplant is 8-14 inches in height. A pyramidal formed evergreen with needles that appear more blue in color than green. This spruce prefers moist soil conditions but can also tolerate drought. It is **deer resistant** and is a good border planting used for screening out structures or as a wind break .

White Pine - *Pinus strobus*, attains a height of 80 to 110 feet tall, the largest eastern conifer. This 2-2 transplant is 10-18 inches in height. The branches are few and spreading with slightly upturned tips. The needles are blue green in color and are soft and flexible . The cones are slender and thornless, 3 to 10 inches long and tapered.

Norway Spruce - *Pinus abies*, attains a height of 40 to 60 feet tall. This 3 year seedling is 7-14 inches in height. The branches line the trunk to the ground. The new needles have white lines on each side and mature from light green to dark, glossy green. The cones are up to 4 inches long and pendulous, maturing from purple or green to light brown. It is commonly used as a windbreak or screen.

Common Lilac—*Syringa vulgaris*, attains a height up to 15 feet. This 2 year seedling is 6 inches in height. The tree is a multi stemmed tall shrub with gray to brown bark. Flowers appear in late spring and are light purple from 4 to 7 inches long, and fragrant. This tree is very nostalgic and is often associated with sweet fragrance that permeates the home.

Kousa Dogwood-Chinensis – *Cornus kousa*, attains a height of 15 to 20 feet tall. This 3 year seedling is 24 inch in height. The tree has beautiful exfoliating bark, long lasting white flowers , and a good fall color. The branches grow upright when the tree is young but appear in horizontal layers on mature trees. The crown eventually grows wider than it is tall.
